Writing 22B: Grammar & Editing Workshop Spring 2017

Writing 22B offers instruction on selected topics in grammar and conventions of written English as needed to strengthen the writing of students whose primary language is not Standard English. The course provides students practice in applying these editing and rhetorical skills.

Writing 22B goals include 1) improved editing skills, 2) enhanced grasp of research methods and principles (data base searches, research proposals, annotated bibliographies, etc.), 3) more strategic organization of longer assignments, 4) shared scholarship in an academic community.

Writing 22B is designed for students who are enrolled in a spring quarter section of Writing 2 (priority given to students who have recently satisfied the Entry Level Writing Requirement). Students are asked to bring research-related and other writing tasks from their Writing 2 classes to edit and revise in class meetings. Enrollment in this 3-credit course is by instructor permission; enrollment is limited to 22.
